IMPACT REPORT

National Brain Awareness Week 2026 took place from March 16th to March 22nd. The week promoted a greater awareness of the brain and brain conditions, as well as the need for more investment in services, research and prevention.

It was supported by over **50** patient organisations, research groups and the wider neurological community, and the NAI has led the way in co-ordinating the week throughout Ireland since 2005. It is one of NAI's key campaigns, and preparation and planning starts months in advance.

Did you know that there are currently 860,000+ people living in Ireland with a neurological condition, and the NAI is the national umbrella organisation for the 40+ groups that represent them?

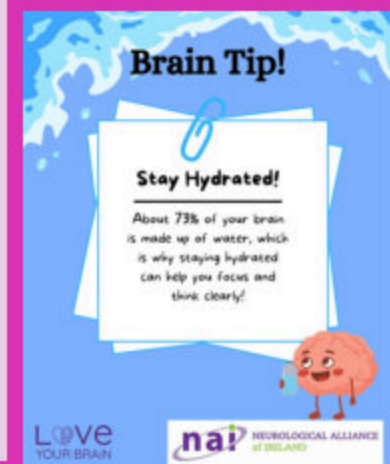

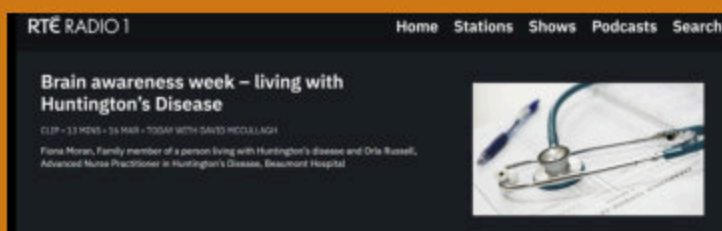
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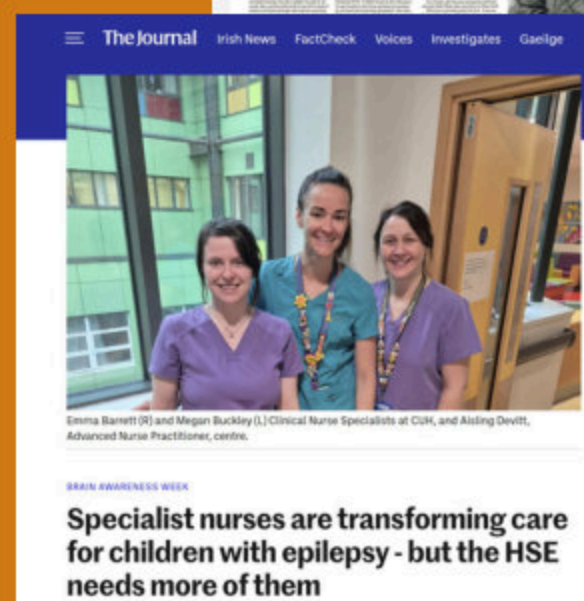
